Our mission is to support the Woodland Hills School District and its communities by strengthening the educational experience of our children.



We are an independent non-profit organization and a proponent of public education, specifically the Woodland Hills School District.



We work to fill gaps in public education funding, focus on community building and volunteerism, and to set the stage for secondary education aspirations.



We fund scholarships, programs, projects and events (not supported by tax dollars) by helping bring community resources to students and teachers.



### HOW DOES THE FOUNDATION ACHIEVE THIS?



The Foundation raises funds through grant-writing, special events, online appeals (through social media, Giving Tuesday and more) and through matching donors to projects (through our Dream Book, Scholarships and more)



The Foundation collects funds on behalf of the School District in order to assist with creating a case for support (providing necessary documents, statements of support, narratives, etc.) record management and gift acknowledgement. Once funds are collected, they are distributed back to the school

# MINI-GRANTS

Mini-Grants are modest **cash awards** that help educators make a **positive difference** in the **learning experience** of their students through **innovative teaching ideas.** 



200 Mini-Grants totaling \$120,000 have been awarded since 2002



In 2019, nine Mini-Grants were awarded, totaling \$8,631.45 In 2020, minigrants were put on hold due to COVID but in 2021 \$4,238 in Mini-Grants were awarded.




funding.


























# Virtual Chocolate & Diamonds Affair







# Other Ways We Help



Nearly 1,600 Chromebooks were purchased with the \$235,000 raised through the Chromebook fund. While Principal Woods started the initiative after just five days, he approached the Foundation to help secure additional funding.



In 2021, the Foundation secured \$4,000 in funding in order to fill backpacks with food for students in our District with food insecurities. Social workers fill bags every Friday for nearly 70 students so that they have meals over the weekend.



In 2021, The Foundation raised and awarded \$2,765 towards Hohn's Helping Hands. In addition, the Foundation secured and delivered over 130 backpacks, stuffed with supplies as well as an additional 200 empty backpacks, thanks to a partnership with Ellen Alston of the Churchill-Wilkins Rotary and Volunteers of America.



# EITC STEM-ROBOTICS FUNDING



In 2021, the Foundation awarded the WHSD Robotics Program with \$8,800 in EITC funding. The Foundation purchased drones, Robot Kits, batteries, memory cards, tutorials and idea books in order to assist in building the District's STEM/Robotics Programs. This was made possible through generous donations from MSA, The Safety Company and Dollar Bank.



When High School Principal Shelly Manns turned to social media with a plea for help in early December 2021, the Foundation was there! Her idea? Provide every student in the High School with a small holiday gift. It was a huge undertaking, but parents and staff jumped into action, raising over \$2,500 towards their \$6,000 goal. The Foundation committed itself to making up the difference and presented Principal Manns with a check in the amount of \$3,595.



In 2021 the Foundation took on the responsibility of creating a combined Woodland Hills School District/Woodland Hills Foundation E-Newsletter, which is published monthly and sent to all families in the District as well as to the Foundation's own database of friends and supporters. Stories should be sent to Renee Englert by first week of each month.
