



Joélisa McDonald is a proud graduate of the Woodland Hills School District, where she began her educational journey in kindergarten and completed her high school education. She earned her bachelor's degree from Point Park University and a master's degree from Duquesne University.

Raised in the Hawkins Village housing community, Joélisa's path is a testament to resilience, community, and the power of believing in what is possible. Her leadership is rooted in service, collaboration, and a commitment to lifting others as she climbs. She leads with empathy, transparency, and an unwavering focus on community impact.

Joélisa made history as the first African American and first woman elected Mayor of Rankin Borough. As mayor, she has been a strong advocate for food security, educational access, and public safety. She also serves as a police commissioner and helped found the Eastern Regional Mon Valley Police Department, strengthening regional collaboration and community-centered policing.

After completing her graduate studies, Joélisa returned to the Woodland Hills School District as a substitute educator, continuing her commitment to supporting students and giving back to the community that shaped her.



Erin Wall

2026 Distinguished Educator of the Year

Erin Wall, a veteran educator, and a proud Johnstown native is a graduate of Westmont Hilltop High School. Erin's path was profoundly shaped by her parents, Dr. Rod Wall and the late Mrs. Catherine Wall. From her father, a respected cardiologist, she learned the importance of dedication and care for the community.

From her mother—also an English teacher who was known for her exceptionally loving and nurturing spirit—Erin inherited a passion for literature and a heart for mentorship.

Since joining the District in 2005, Erin has dedicated 20 years to the classroom, teaching a wide range of courses including AP Language and Composition, English 10 Honors, and English 11. She holds a B.S. from The Pennsylvania State University (2001), an M.A. in English Literature from Duquesne University (2003), and a Reading Specialist certificate from the University of Pittsburgh (2004). Most recently, while on an educational sabbatical in 2023, she completed a DEI certificate from CCAC to further her mission of fostering equity and inclusive dialogue.

In 2018, deeply impacted by the tragic loss of her student, Antwon Rose II, Erin turned community grief into a movement. With the help of a courageous group of students and her colleagues she founded the Woodland Hills Multi-District Student Summit. What started as an internal event is now in its 7th year. Over the past six years, the summit has empowered more than 1,000 students from over 25 school districts. Their central focus is creating unity between rural, urban, and suburban communities during a period of deep division. Their initiative is one of the first student led summits in Western Pennsylvania. Through her work, Erin continues to honor her roots and her family's legacy of care, ensuring that every student has the platform to lead and the support to be heard.



Backpacks of Hope provides 70+ of our most in-need students with backpacks filled with six easy to prepare weekend meals every Friday throughout the school year. As of Feb 27, we have also begun to take over costs associated with the Free Food Pantry at the High School. With a current combined budget of just \$10,000, further support would allow us to assist even more students and to provide fresh fruits and vegetables and meals over long school breaks.



Dream Book

Teachers are invited to share their "Dreams" for programs, teaching innovations and supplies they simply cannot get because there isn't money in the school's budget. Dreams are compiled into our Dream Book and shared with our network of donors to choose which programs they'd like to support. Since 2016, 58 Dreams have been fulfilled, totaling nearly \$62,000.



Scholarships

We are proud to help deserving students in Woodland Hills achieve their full potential after high school. To-date, 135 scholarships totaling nearly \$178,204 have been awarded for post-secondary education including technical, vocational, and baccalaureate degrees. This year, \$16,500 will be awarded.



Mini Grants

Mini-Grants are modest cash awards that help educators make a positive difference in the learning experience of their students. Mini-Grants support, encourage, and facilitate great teaching ideas in the classroom. To date, over 210 Mini-Grants have been awarded, totaling over \$130,000.
